### RESOLUTION 26-2008

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO FILE, ON BEHALF OF THE CITY OF TWINSBURG, AN APPLICATION TO THE STATE OF OHIO DEPARTMENT OF DEVELOPMENT FOR ROADWAY IMPROVEMENT FUNDS TO SUPPORT THE EXTENSION OF HIGHLAND ROAD

**WHEREAS**, the City of Twinsburg desires to improve the City's roadway network in support of commerce, economic development, public health, safety and general welfare; and,

**WHEREAS**, extension of Highland Road east of S.R. 91 is needed to support development of currently vacant unimproved land in the City of Twinsburg; and,

**WHEREAS**, the extension of Highland Road east of S.R. 91 will provide improved access to G.E. Energy, a growing company and important employer within the City of Twinsburg; and,

**WHEREAS**, improved access to G.E. Energy's land will reduce hazardous roadway conditions and reduce congestion on S.R. 91; and,

**WHEREAS**, the extension of Highland Road east of S.R. 91 will implement the first phase of a roadway segment recommended in the City of Twinsburg's Comprehensive Plan adopted by Council in February 2007.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Council of the City of Twinsburg, County of Summit and State of Ohio;

**SECTION 1:** The Mayor is hereby authorized and directed for, and on behalf of, the City of Twinsburg, to apply for the Grant in order to support and sustain economic development efforts in the City by improving roadway access to industrial land.

**SECTION II:** The City of Twinsburg does hereby agree to obligate the funds required to satisfactorily complete the proposed project and become eligible for reimbursement under the terms and conditions of the granting program.

**SECTION III:** It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting or meetings of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public and in full compliance with all legal requirements, including without limitation, those set forth in Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

**SECTION IV:** That this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, welfare and convenience of the citizens of the City of Twinsburg, and for the additional reason to apply for funding in a timely manner in order to allow the City the best opportunity to received said funding, and provided it receives the affirmative vote of five or more members of Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval of the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest period allowed by law.
