RESOLUTION 18-2008

A RESOLUTION ALLOWING THE MAYOR TO APPLY FOR FEDERAL RESURFACING FUNDS PROGRAMMED BY THE AKRON METROPOLITAN AREA TRANSPORTATION STUDY (AMATS) TO IMPROVE LIBERTY ROAD; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Liberty Road is in need of Resurfacing; and

WHEREAS, Maintaining the roads by periodic resurfacing is a cost effective approach to extend the life cycle of the road and provide a safe surface for the traveling public within the City of Twinsburg; and

WHEREAS, Liberty Road is multi-jurisdictional, and City of Twinsburg (73.14 %) agrees to take the lead in this joint project with the County of Summit (15 %) and the Village of Reminderville (11.76 %)

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Twinsburg, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1. That the Mayor is hereby authorized to apply for Federal Resurfacing Funds programmed by the Akron Metropolitan Area Transportation Study (AMATS) for the following :

- (1) Liberty Road Resurfacing – consist of resurfacing Liberty Road from Cannon Rd to the Solon Corp Limits (approx 2.6 miles). Include ADA curb ramps, manhole adjustments, pavement markings, loop detectors and base repair as required (base repairs are at 100% locally funded) with an estimated cost of \$ 750,000.

SECTION 2. That the City of Twinsburg acknowledges and understands the AMATS “Funding Policy Guidelines” and confirms to the best of its knowledge that the information contained in the project application is accurate, that it intends to diligently pursue that project, and that a local share is required to match federal funds.

SECTION 3. That it is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of the Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were meeting open to the public and in compliance with the law.

SECTION 4. This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety convenience and welfare of the City of Twinsburg and the inhabitants thereof, for the reason that it is to apply for this funding within the next 45 days, and provided that it receives the approval of two-thirds of the members of Council, shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval; otherwise to be in full force and effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
