

## Twinsburg, Ohio USA Profile

Twinsburg is centrally located between Akron and Cleveland in the heart of Ohio's Western Reserve. The city provides its residents and businesses a safe, well-maintained community just minutes away from two of the largest cities in Ohio.

Twinsburg was founded in 1819 by the Wilcox twins, a set of identical twins from Killingworth, Connecticut who arrived and began selling small parcels of land for the Connecticut Land Company at low prices to attract other settlers. The Wilcox twins then offered six acres of land for a public square and \$20.00 toward starting the first school if the residents would change the settlement's name to Twinsburg.

Twinsburg has grown significantly through the 1990's and is now home to more than 18,000 residents. The City reflects a diversified industrial and commercial base with over 700 businesses, an extensive park system and comfortable neighborhoods.

In June, 2005 *Cleveland Magazine* ranked Twinsburg sixth out of sixty-six Northeast Ohio communities. US Census data from 2004 indicate the area has a median home price of \$234,000 and a median household income of \$60,136. There are approximately 8,600 households and the 5-year housing appreciation is 32.58%.

The city is part of the Twinsburg City School District, which also includes Twinsburg Township and the Village of Reminderville. The school system serves over 4,000 students and has received an 'excellent' rating from the State of Ohio. Kent State University also maintains a branch campus in the city. Twinsburg's public library has been rated #1 nationally in its population category by Hennen's Public Rating Index.

Community facilities and activities include 1600+ acres of parkland, a city-owned fitness center, natatorium and golf course. Twinsburg plays host to the Annual Twins Days Celebration, named the largest annual gathering of twins by the *Guinness Book of World Records*. 2005 celebrated the events 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary.
