**CAUCUS:**

The caucus meeting was called to order at 6:59 pm.

**Items for Discussion:**

Ms. McFearin asked why the boards and commission members do not get sworn in at a council meeting instead of at the individual board or commission meetings. She believes it would be a nice way to recognize our residents. Mr. Scaffide stated he would think it was because the members don't attend the council meetings. Mr. Furey stated it is easier to swear in at the meetings. Mr. Scaffide stated that is what we have always done but doesn't mean we always have to. Mr. Bellan commented that if you swear everyone in on one night it may take a long time. Mr. Maistros stated most of the positions are paid and he would have to look into if the city would need to pay them for attending a council meeting to get sworn in. Ms. McFearin stated maybe not for this time but maybe we can get the board and commissions feelings on this for the next time. Mayor Yates it would be nice but you may end up still swearing some in at their meetings if they cannot attend the council meeting.

Mrs. Gaydosh thanked council for reconsidering Ordinance 04-2019 regarding zoning code 1181.05. She understands that it maintains council's final authority on site plans. She spoke about the history of this section.

**Pending Legislation:**

Ordinance 05-2019 – Dispatch Contract with Reminderville

Mr. Maistros stated this is the third and final reading for the Dispatching contract with Reminderville.

The mayor stated this contract will be before their council this evening.

Mr. Furey stated that the contract is more in line with what the cost of services provided is but still does not recoup the full cost of all items. He would like to see this contract be similar to the fire contract which includes cost of capital items. He believes this is a step in the right direction but would like to see these costs fully incorporated down the road. He has a concern that this contract will rollover without being looked at in three years. Therefore he would like to make a motion during the regular meeting to remove the language in section five of the contract that allows for an automatic renewal of one year.

Mrs. Buccigross requested that budget be put on its third and final reading that it be placed on emergency to allow for timely passage.

Mr. Campbell stated this will extend the Waste Management agreement for three years.

Mr. Campbell stated there may be some additional items from the Fitness Center added to the ordinance. He will amend the list prior to passage.

Mr. Scaffide stated that some of the striping we have done seems to be more permanent than others. He asked which one will be used for this year's program. Ms. Mohr stated that depending on funding and the location of the street (main streets vs. side streets) will determine what type is used. The cost of the thermoplast is obviously more than traditional striping but it lasts longer can weigh out the same.

Mr. Maistros stated this is to replace the current T1 lines for police and fire radio systems. The microwave network is more reliable. Total contract cost is \$70,000 broken down between three vendors. Ms. McFearin asked if this was the same agreement that was significantly more money but Chief Noga was able to negotiate down. Mr. Maistros stated yes it is.

Resolution 29-2019 - Agreement with School for Buses for Camp

Mayor Yates stated that this will allow us to continue to provide bus services for the camps we offer. The cost to provide this has continued to go up. To help offset this the cost of camp will increase slightly but still remain an affordable option for residents.

**PUBLIC PARTICIPATION:**

**Sally Gaydosh – 9250 Liberty Road**

Mrs. Gaydosh reiterated what she stated in the caucus meeting, that she is grateful that the language in Ordinance 04-2019 to satisfy council need to approve site plans. She is still concerned with the lack of consideration given to the charter and zoning code. She spoke about past court cases and rulings. She stated it is dangerous for a city to not have a zoning code.

**Rob Felber & Seth Rodin**

Mr. Felber & Mr. Rodin spoke about the upcoming School Renewal Levy. Mr. Felber stated this will be a \$4 million renewal levy and will not cost tax payers any more money. It will allow for the schools to maintain the current educational opportunities for students. Mr. Rodin asked council for a Resolution in support of the upcoming levy.

**Loren Sengstock – 2704 Arbor Glen #105**

Mr. Sengstock spoke about the budget. He stated that the city is again this year going to accept the mayor's budget of \$57.1 million and it is a deficit spending budget, not balanced. He stated that expenses are not really getting trimmed out of the budget. The city's general fund is heading into a fiscal crisis. He stated council cannot continue this deficit spending.

**Shelia Williams**

Ms. Williams spoke about the Rising Star program the Kent State is doing. This is a targeted program for at risk kids, which starts in middle school. It is economically based, first generation family member, along with other criteria. If students participate in it they have to opportunity to go to Kent State for free.

Ms. Williams also invited council to the State of the Health Department event on April 9<sup>th</sup>. She would love to have council hear what all the department is doing.

She also spoke about the Ethan's Green HOA meeting. Some things that concerned her that were brought up. Of those items, garbage in the yards, garbage cans, etc. She encouraged the city to pick up the pace of our drive/walk arounds. As a council, mayor and city we need to address the things that are slowly happening to our city because little things become medium things, then larger and out of control.

In regards to the SR 91 project, she asked council, mayor and Ms. Mohr to walk around with her once the weather breaks. She has concerns and wants to make sure they are addressed.

She also spoke about rental properties and parking bans, noise, not being able to pull out of their driveway. She stated the city needs to have some sort of rental policy in this city.

She also handed the clerk a page from AAA magazine about roundabouts.

**DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORTS:**

**Russ Rodic – Building Commissioner**

- Construction activity through Building Division for the month of February reported 47 applications for plan review with a construction value of \$623,294, field staff performed 119 inspections, and 13 point of sale applications were processed,
- Double pole update, Windstream has begun removal of the abandon poles, process of cutting at the grade level of the pole, began operation in the Glenwood acres subdivision,
- Building division is developing an electronic plan review process for applications limiting to roofing, siding, concrete, and window replacements of such work to be performed.

Mrs. Stauffer asked Mr. Rodic to explain the electronic plan review. Mr. Rodic stated there is an application with list of things the homeowner/contractor are going to do. It will help to simplify the process.

Mr. Scaffide asked if when the old poles are removed from the double pole situation if they will only be cut to grade or fully removed. Mr. Rodic stated they will be cut to grade. Mr. Scaffide wanted to make sure it will be cut so soil and grass could be planted. Mr. Rodic stated from his understanding that is correct.

Ms. McFearin asked if there was an updated on the donation bins and the program where building staff was leaving the property maintenance doorknockers. Mr. Rodic stated he has two applications for the donation boxes, some have been removed, some are getting screening placed around them. As far as property maintenance program, the will be starting it back up once the weather breaks. Mr. Barr asked if Mr. Rodic would kindly stop by Ethan's Green. Mr. Furey stated that it was discussed at the HOA meeting that someone's stuff is there stuff and they may be allowed to have it in their yard even if the neighbor doesn't like it. Mr. Scaffide asked if the Building Department could please let council know when they will be in what areas. Mr. Rodic stated they would.

Mr. Steele mentioned that there is a home in his ward that has some issues but his understanding is there is not much the city can do.

### **Tim Morgan – Fire Chief**

#### **Call Volume**

- The fire department ran a total of 220 calls this February, for the year that is 470 calls, which down 6% compared to last year.

#### **Notes**

- There were no notable events last month

#### **Fire Prevention**

- Inspected 19 locations and 1 fire investigations.

#### **Training**

- There were 14 hours of Public Education totally about 180 personal contacts
- Department logged 104 training events which was approximately 398 hours of training.

#### **Points of Interest**

- Weather Warning Sirens: March's monthly test of the system was conducted on the 2nd, and all sirens functioned properly. We are also anticipating taking part in Ohio's Statewide Tornado Siren Test on March 20th, at 09:50am.

**Tom Mason – Police Lieutenant**

- During the month of January the City of Twinsburg Communications Center generated 2,361 calls for service among the Twinsburg Police and Fire Departments and the Reminderville Police and Fire Departments.
- Twinsburg police officers arrested and/or cited 142 suspects into court on 226 different counts. The arrest counts include: (1) count of Involuntary Manslaughter, (21) Drug related charges, (3) Liquor possession/Open container charges, (27) for Driving under suspension or without a valid license, (29) Operating a vehicle under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs of abuse charges, (1) Domestic violence charges, (13) Warrants served, (3) counts of Obstructing official business/Evidence destruction, (7) Improper handling/carrying concealed weapons charges (2 felony), and (1) charge of Fleeing/eluding an officer (felony). The remaining charges were various other criminal or traffic related charges.
- Twinsburg officers issued 239 written warnings and 9 parking citations.
- Officers investigated 32 traffic crashes of which 6 were injury crashes, 7 were on private property, and none were fatal.
- Stated Sgt. Mark Kreiger will be retiring. Detective Brian Donato will be promoted to the open sergeant position.

Mr. Furey asked Lt. Mason if the patrols take a look at any parked cars on White Ash Trail. This seems to be a narrow street and there have been some concerns. Lt. Mason said he would have them do that.
