Mr. Finch stated this ordinance provides for the consolidation of a parcel of property that is part of Cornerstone Phase 1 & 2 to enable the expansion of Performance Food Group (PFG). Mr. Furey asked if this was approved by Planning Commission, Mr. Finch stated they approved it in June.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION:

Chuck Bonacci – 11327 Heritage Drive

Mr. Bonacci thanked the city for bringing a metal band to Rock the Park. He stated it was the most fun he has had in Twinsburg since 1983. He was able to bring his mom and dad which was special for him. He stated he talked to those in attendance from other communities who wish their town had something like rock the park. He thanked everyone who helped make the night happen. He wanted to come speak on some of the positive things that happen in our community.

Daisy Walker

Mrs. Walker spoke on some things the Environmental Commission is working on.

- I contacted Erica Miglet — Mold Rite Co. on Highland Road, regarding the "Adopt a Street" program. Mold Rite Co. has accepted this program by performing a valuable community service by adopting this street to keep clear of litter and debris. This program will be a partnership between the City of Twinsburg and Mold Rite to adopt an area of Highland road and take responsibility for keeping the street clean. Amy Mohr and I will be working on the documentation of this program.
- Kevin Elkins, Facilities Manager at Rockwell Automation on Highland Road, is requesting a 'clean-up letter' for the company to participate in our fall clean-up in October. Included in the letter will be a request to provide tee shirts or recyclable bags with the City of Twinsburg logo. Mr. Elkins stated he will provide items for the clean-up. October 19th is the clean-up day.
- The Environmental Commission is looking for Twinsburg residents who have volunteered to pick up trash/litter throughout the City. If you know of a resident who has picked up trash around the City for 5 years or more, please contact the Environmental Commission or call City Hall with their name and number. The Environmental Commission will acknowledge their efforts with a Letter of Appreciation in October 2019.
- Keep America Beautiful has a Cigarette Butt Grant for cities in Ohio who have a Cigarette Litter Prevention Program. Cigarette butts make up 32% of litter in storm drains. 95% of cigarette butts are composed of cellulose acetate that takes over 35 years to decompose. The grant, which will be for \$2000, is open through November 2019. Patrick Jeffries and I will pursue this grant,

- Sherwin-Williams sponsors 'Keep Ohio Beautiful Paint Grant Program. This program provides community groups with paint and painting supplies and enables the groups to renew a community structure in need into something beautiful. Sherwin Williams will provide up to 40 gallons of exterior paints. The Environmental Commission will apply for the paint grant in February 2020.

Michael Turle – 9930 Forest Lake Drive

Mr. Turle spoke regarding Twinsburg Old School and to clarify a few things. He stated he wanted to save the historical significance of the building which included the Western Reserve architectural style of red brick. The Old School did pass the State of Ohio's qualifications as a historical building and recommended it to the federal list. He stated with more time they could have had the potential to get funding. He stated that according to his math city records don't show an accurate accounting for the building.

Mr. Furey stated he recalls the last time Mr. Turle was in he was inquiring about money but did not stay at the meeting long enough to see the mayor's presentation which would have answered his question. Mr. Furey stated that the decision to remove the Old School was discussed over an eight year period.

MAYOR’S REPORT:

- Attended the Public Hearing tonight. Thanked all who came out. Stated he understand there are people both for and against this rezoning but hopes that council will pass this legislation and let the residents decide.
- Service Department is working on our sidewalk leveling program
- Fire department is doing currently doing hydrant flushing along with the striping and painting of the hydrants by the Service Department.
- Both SR91 projects should be wrapping up before school starts
- Rock the Park – Thanked Mr. Bonacci for his enthusiasm for the Metal themed concert. Attended the Cleveland Pops concert and there are two more concerts this month
- Fox 8 News will be featuring the Clubhouse on their Kickin’ it with Kenny segment on 7/19

DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORTS:

Chris Campbell – Public Works Director

- **Roadway Maintenance** – During the months of June and July to date no pot holes have been patched.
- Patching of roads was performed on Gettysburg, Haverhill and Ravenna (NW of E. Idlewood). Patching of the area at the site of the Ravenna Rd. Cleveland Water repair began today.
- **Animal Control** – Crews removed 13 dead animals from the streets. We will continue to work with A & S Animal Control for trapping etc.
- **Storm Area Checks** – The collection areas were cleaned on twice in June due to the heavy rain fall.
- **Microturbine** – The Wastewater department’s microturbine continues to run well
- **Branch Chipping** – The July chipping was completed today with 590 stops with 149.0 cu yd of material collected.
 - Next Round** – The next round of chipping will begin on Monday, August 5.
- **Street Sweeping** – The second trip through the city will be completed in the next couple of weeks.
- **Storm Water System** – Various repairs to the system are being performed, including: ditch line cleaning, pipe sealing and catch basin repairs.
- **Striping** - Painting of the parking space lines in all city-owned parking lots is being performed.

- **Roadside Berm Mowing** – Mowing of the berms continues
- **Tinker’s Creek Cleaning** – Removal of debris from Tinker’s Creek was completed on July 1 with 15 yd. of debris removed. The crew will return to the “South” bridge (near Dodge Middle School) to remove a large tree.
- **City Item Auction** – We are completing the sale of all items approved on the latest list.
- **Roadway Crack Sealing** – Due to wet and then hot weather, the program has been shut down until fall.
- **Upcoming Projects:**
 - Hydrant painting to begin next week
 - Sidewalk Leveling will begin in early August
 - Roadway crack sealing will begin in the fall when temperatures are cooler
 - Sanitary sewer repair on Gettysburg Dr.

Mr. Bellan asked if Service was doing the tree trimming in conjunction with the branch pick-up. Mr. Campbell stated that it is not the same program but can be run at the same time.

Mr. Steele asked how much the city brought in off the auction. Mr. Campbell stated he will have to look but there were no vehicles on this one so the amount will not be as high as past auctions.

Ms. McFearn stated that Service is doing a great job restoring the pavilion at the golf course.

Chris Noga – Police Chief

- Asked that all please keep the family of Josh Miktarian in their prayers. It will be eleven years this Saturday since he passed away.
- Stated National Night Out will also have a dunk tank which the Mayor and Chief will be in. Funds raised will go to Our Community Hunger Center

Mr. Steele asked if the city was doing something at the memorial for Josh. Chief Noga stated that since the Miktarian Golf Outing is that day they will be doing a moment of silence at the golf course.

Tim Morgan – Fire Chief

Call Volume

- The fire department ran a total of 214 calls this June, for the year that is 1461 calls, which up 3% compared to last year.

Fire Prevention

- Inspected 13 locations and 3 fire investigations.

Training

- There were 22 hours of Public Education totally about 237 personal contacts
- Department logged 140 training events which was approximately 390 hours of training.

Notable Events

- Event #19-12602, 6/2 @ 12:01: Tower 1 responded to Bainbridge with a crew of 3 to assist with a house fire. The crew remained on scene for about an hour assisting with extinguishment and overhaul.
- Event #19-12660, 6/3 @ 10:45: Called to a Chamberlin Rd. residence for a car fire next to a garage. The fire involved a 1998 Corvette project car, that was a total loss, crews quickly

extinguished the fire, which resulted in minor damage to the siding of the garage. There were no injuries.

- Event #19-14619, 6/25 @ 16:35: Responded to a Ravenna Rd. location for a car on fire. The fire started in the driver's compartment and resulted in minor burns to the driver. The fire was extinguished and the patient was transported to Akron Children's Hospital by a Macedonia med unit.
- intoxication/Overdose related calls: 4, with one resulting in a fatality.

Points of Interest

- Weather Warning Sirens: July's monthly test of the system was conducted on the 6th, and all sirens functioned properly.
- Entrance Exam: We anticipate selecting a person to fill our current opening by the end of the month.
- Captains Promotional: Gina DeVito-Staub is being promoted to Captain effective July 9, 2019.
- Hydrant Flushing: Of the almost 1900 hydrants in the City and Township, over 900 have been completed.

Larry Finch – Community and Economic Development Director

- Building Department responded to a complaint of storm water basin failure and water running onto a private road between the Hilton Garden Inn and Wilcox Drive. In investigating the complaint it was found that the storm water basin serving the Freeway Business Park Condominium flex industrial buildings had failed due to inadequate maintenance. The owner's association was contacted and instructed to make temporary repairs and provide the City with an engineer's report indicating improvements to be made to make the basin functional in line with its original design. The owner's association is meeting this week.
- Division has been impacted by the retirement of Russ Rodic and Dennis Koballa. We have interviewed candidates for part-time zoning and utility coordinator and will likely be making an offer of hire. We are still seeking candidates for the CBO position.
- Council has received a digital copy of the Downtown Redevelopment District Preliminary Plan. Questions? I will ask the council to refer the document to the Planning Commission for review and comment over the summer Council recess. We can pick the matter back up at Council on your return.
- Moving forward on the potential NOPEC grant application for installation of Electric Vehicle charging stations. We will likely do 10 charging stations and have identified 3 separate and very viable locations. We have met with a contractor and toured the sites and will be getting cost estimate information from the contractor. We will then be able to complete the application to NOPEC.
- The next TCIC meeting is scheduled for next Monday, July 15 at 6pm in the Jury Room.

Sarah Buccigross – Finance Director

- Finance is continuing to work with the Auditor of State Performance Audit team on the city-wide Performance Audit. The kick-off meeting was held on July 8th with Department Heads and the Mayor. This meeting covered the process/procedures of the audit and individual department sessions were scheduled with the auditor. The Performance Audit is expected to be complete in the 1st quarter of 2020.
- The City has supplied the financial Auditors with all requested documentation. The audit is currently on extension and is expected to be completed by month end.

- Finance has distributed the 2020 budget worksheets to all Departments. Training was completed today by Finance & Police on a possible automated budgeting option available through our VIP accounting software.
- Interest earnings through June 30, 2019 are \$125,282.38. This is an increase of 30.11% over the interest earnings at June 30, 2018 of \$96,289.27.
- The sewer billing module is scheduled for implementation next week. This will be the last piece of our accounting system to be integrated from E-Gov into VIP. The City's accounting software will be down during this implementation and notice has been sent out to the impacted users.

Mr. Bellan pointed out that the PUD portion is 5.19 acres and the Public Facilities portion is 14.01 acres.

Mr. Barr stated that the important part of this is letting the people vote. He stated he does believe the city owns more parkland than any other city in Summit County outside of the county itself.

Mr. Bellan stated that Mrs. Clark mentioned it tonight and Mr. Steele as mentioned it before about if this were to be rezoned and sold could any proceeds be earmarked to pay down the clubhouse. He asked Mr. Maistros what the city would have to do to make that happen. Mr. Maistros stated at the sale of the property they could put in the legislation what the funds would be earmarked for.

Mr. Steele stated that he thinks a resolution should be passed before the vote of the people. Mr. Furey stated it could be done after recess and confirmed this with Mr. Maistros who stated it could be done and depending on timing would need to be worked out with finance.

Ms. McFearin stated it could take time to find a developer that will build based on what the city would like to see there.

Mr. Steele stated it shouldn't be too hard because Twinsburg is a great place to live.

Mr. Scaffide stated that Mr. Barr and Mr. Bellan made good points and stated that he does not have any problem with taking money earned on sale and putting it on the clubhouse debt. He stated that he has also heard that the city needs more housing like this for seniors. He is in favor of putting this back on the ballot for the residents to vote on.

Mr. Furey stated he agrees that the proceeds should go to the clubhouse debt.
