Amy Mohr – City Engineer

- Ravenna Road 95% complete, have a couple of curb ramps to need to be re-done
- SR91
 - o Shifted traffic earlier this month

- Excavated/undercut northern portion of project and stone base
- Working on Southern portion and storm sewer work currently on Ethan's, a lot of buried fiber optic/communication cables causing some interference/re-route
- In the next month continue excavation/stone base for pavement, storm sewer and installing underdrain and then curbs. Working toward base pavement to shift traffic in Dec.
- Met today with FEMA representative. Met with FEMA to kick off 9833 E. Idlewood. The State is anticipating approx. \$20M in grant funding for HMGP (Hazard Mitigation Grant Program) funding. This funding is used to prevent loss disaster relief.. Every \$1 spent saves approx. \$7 flood plain home purchases fit criteria. The program is a disaster relief program and as such funding match only 12.5%. Anticipated that next round will be early 2019 (we will need application Feb) with funding match in 2020 budget.
- Working with Summit County Engineer on Agreement for Resurfacing Chamberlin Rd from Highland to SR82 hope to have that legislation to you next month for adoption.
- Ravenna/Richmond Road Intersection Improvement: Reviewed plan progress with Chagrin Valley Engineers. They will be working on completing and determining right of way needs. Right turn lanes on Ravenna and Left turn Shepard.
- Slowly been getting utilities to relocate on SR91 from Ravenna to Tinkers for Sanitary Sewer replacement project. OPWC loan. Still plan to Bid this year with award anticipated in January construction when weather breaks.
- Working on project close outs from previous projects and on next year's roadway resurfacing quantities to finalize estimate and roads.
- NPDES Compliance POST CONSTRUCTION storm water maintenance
- Annual reporting tracking down property owners for reports.
- With Planning Dept. updated the post construction storm water agreement for developers. Website –Engineering/Strom water management/ Storm water inspection forms. Also require it to be recorded document so property ownership transfer do have to track down and educate owners.
- Subdivisions:
- Quarry Reserve Developer is installing underground utilities Sanitary mainline complete, storm and waterline work continuing. Anticipate paving end of November.
- Whispering Wood Ph3 legislation for development agreement, anticipate mass clearing and grading in Nov and starting underground utilities.
- Cornerstone Relocation of Cul-de-Sac (Part of O'Reilly and Spec Building development) -Sanitary and water work done. Testing and Paving still to occur.
- Shepard Preserve Building permits can now be issued.
- Corbett's maintenance bond punch list, conversion of Storm water basins to post construction, adjusting /exposing castings that were buried during building process. Still have pavement review and rear drainage correction assessment in the spring.

Mrs. Stauffer asked Ms. Mohr if the city has looked at putting sidewalks on SR91 from the square to the clinic. Ms. Mohr they have not but the city did widen shoulders for bicycles. The embankments under the bridge would make it difficult. Mrs. Stauffer would like to have this added to the next Safety meeting.

- October 2018 Income tax receipts total \$1,923,754.75 compared to October 2017 receipts in the amount of \$2,216,951.24. This reflects a decrease of 13.23% or 293,196.49 compared to last year.
- 2018 YTD income tax receipts total \$19,538,121.08 compared to 2017 in the amount of \$19,116,311.41. This reflects an increase of 2.21% or \$421,809.67 compared to last year.
- Refunds in the amount of \$9,276.25 are included in the October collections.
- The net change in distribution for this month for individual, net profit and withholder collectively is: \$228,783.58.
