The parade will 'step-off' at 6:30pm on Saturday, December 4th, 2021 at Twinsburg City Hall, 10075 Ravenna Road and will end at the Twinsburg Township Square. To participate in the parade all floats must be lighted and Holiday-themed (Christmas lights, garland, wreaths, bells, trees, snowmen, reindeer, elves, etc.). Please, no Santa Claus. Parade participants are encouraged to dress in holiday costumes/attire and holiday music is strongly encouraged. People's Choice Awards will be voted on via Facebook to showcase your holiday creation and a promotional opportunity for any business or group.

Deadline for all Registration Forms is November 24th. SPOTS WILL BE FILLED ON A FIRST COME, FIRST SERVE BASIS.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. Careful consideration is to be given to float construction and decorations. Remember, there are street lamps and overhead wires along the parade route. Float should not be wider than 8 feet and be less than 14 feet in height. Outside of these factors when designing and decorating your entry it is recommended that you view and drive the parade route prior to December. The route is from Twinsburg City Hall to the Township Square/Church Street.
2. All entries must be decorated with a holiday theme (lights, wreaths, Christmas trees, snowmen, reindeer, elves, etc.) Parade officials will review each entry for decoration prior to the start of the event.
3. *We do not want to confuse the children so no Santa impersonators will be allowed. Any entry that depicts Santa will be excluded from the lineup.*
4. Holiday costumes or attire recommended.
5. Please refrain from throwing items from floats, such as candy. Thrown items can injure spectators and entice children to run into the parade route to pick them up, this is especially dangerous because this is a night time parade. Violators will be held responsible for all clean-up costs and/or fines, and may not be allowed to enter the parade the following year. Two individuals from each float will be the only representatives who are allowed to walk.
6. No items may be sold from your float or entry unless approved by the Parks & Recreation Director.
7. If you are decorating your entry at the staging area, remember to bring your own materials. You are responsible for all items that you bring with you and you must take them with you (along with any trash) when you “step off”. Parade volunteers will be monitoring this area before the parade departs so we would appreciate your cooperation.
8. All decorations must be properly secured.
9. Explosives or open flames are not allowed.
10. The City of Twinsburg nor any other sponsoring organizations are responsible for any loss or injuries caused to participants during the event.
11. Make sure your float can safely accommodate all riders. To prevent injuries, each rider must be able to easily grab hold of a reinforced portion of the float or be seated. No small or miniature moving vehicles will be allowed in the parade if they are below the view line of the bumper of the vehicle in front or behind them.
12. Anyone riding on a float is responsible for his or her own safety.
13. There is absolutely no alcohol, drug, or tobacco use permitted by parade participants at the line up area or while on route.
14. The maximum speed limit is 6 mph.
15. Parking of floats or vehicles participating in the parade is the responsibility of the contact person.
16. ALL DRIVERS MUST BE AT LEAST 18 YEARS OF AGE AND HAVE A VALID DRIVERS LICENSE.
17. Parade route begins at City Hall, down Ravenna Road and ending on Church Street.
18. Participants may not jump onto or off of any unit and may not interfere with any other unit in the parade.
19. Line up for the parade will begin at 4:30p and the parade will begin promptly at 6:30 pm. The parade will not delay its start time for any participant who is not in the parade line when the parade begins at 6:30 pm. THERE ARE NO EXCEPTIONS.

20. Participants may decorate & assemble their parade float in the City Hall Parking lot starting at 8am on Dec. 4th.
21. All tow vehicles or entries must turn off their headlights throughout the parade route.
22. All vehicles/floats must park on Church Street and remain on Church Street until the road is re-opened at the conclusion of the event.
23. The attached release forms must be completed, signed and submitted to Jennifer Betenson no later than Wednesday, November 24, 2021. No participants will be allowed to participate in the parade unless their signed liability participant forms have been turned in by November 24, 2021.
